

RESOLUTION 2025-09

Resolution of the Town of Sheridan, Montana to Increase Rates for the Users of the Municipal Wastewater System

WHEREAS, under Section 69-7-101, Montana Code Annotated, the Town of Sheridan (Town) has the power and authority to regulate, establish, and change, as it considers proper, rates, charges, and classifications imposed for utility services to its inhabitants and other persons served by the municipal systems. Rates, charges, and classifications must be reasonable and just; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Town to collect sufficient revenues to pay the costs associated with the operation and maintenance of the Wastewater System(System), and to build necessary reserves, and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was mailed to all users of the System notifying them that, pursuant to Resolution 2025-07, adopted May 12, 2025, it was the intention of the Town to increase the rates and charges for users of the System and notice of public hearing was published as required by Section 69-7-11. A public hearing was held on June 19, 2025, at 6:00 pm at the Sheridan Senior Citizen Center, 210 Crofoot St., in the Town of Sheridan, Montana, for the purpose of hearing comments from the public on the wastewater rate increase, and

WHEREAS, all persons appearing were given an opportunity to speak at the public hearing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Council (the "Council") of the Town as follows:

SECTION 1: Current Base Rate Charge. The Town's monthly charge consists of a base rate charge on all connections to the System based on an Equivalent Dwelling Unit ("EDU") system. The base rate charge for each connection is the base rate for the service line times the number of EDU's applicable to the connection. The EDU for each size of service is as follows:

The Town currently charges a base/rate or shut off rate of \$43.00 per month per EDU to users of the System who are connected to the System whether there is actual usage or not. The charges are shown below.

SECTION 2: New Wastewater Rates. Effective the July 2025 bill, the Town will charge all users connected to the System the following water rates.

2.1 Base Rate Charge. The Base Rate Charge will be increased from \$43.00 to \$52.00 per EDU as follows:

2.2 Monthly Usage charge. In addition to the base rate change, the Town will charge a monthly wastewater usage charge of \$2.50 per 1,000 gallons consumed per connection or appropriate charge for gallons of sewage discharged of any 1,000-gallon increment (the usage rate). The wastewater system usage will be calculated on an average using the months of January, February, March, October, November, and December to determine gallons of usage.

2.3 Month Late Fee: The late fee on accounts that are over 30 days past due will receive a \$5.00 penalty fee each month they are past due.

2.4 Monthly Charge: The monthly wastewater charge for each connection consists of the monthly base rate charge plus the monthly usage rate for each connection.

2.5 Rate of Increase: For a user with a ¾ inch service connection and no usage the monthly charge represents an increase of \$9.00 per month over the current monthly charge or approximately 20%. As rates have not increased since 2011 this is an average of 1.42% per year which is less than annual inflation rate increase. For a user with a ¾ inch service connection using 5,000 gallons of sewage a month the proposed monthly represents an increase of \$1.25 over the current monthly charge.

2.6 Non-Sufficient Fund Fee: The Town will also be adding a Non-sufficient Fee of \$5.00 for any checks that are returned for insufficient funds. The fees is for reimbursement of the fee that the Town is charged by the bank.

SECTION 3: Determination of Annual Budget for the System: Each year the Council of the Town shall determine the amount of money needed to pay the costs of the System including but not limited to: (a) the payment of the reasonable expense of operation and maintenance of the System; (b) administration of the System; (c) the payment of the principal and interest on any bonded or other indebtedness of the System; and (d) the establishment of maintenance of any required reserves, including reserves needed for expenditures for depreciation and replacement of facilities, as may be determined necessary from time to time by the Council or as covenanted in the ordinance or resolution authorizing any outstanding bonds of the System. Based on the annual needs of the System, the Council will establish monthly charges for the use of the System.

SECTION 4: Further Rate Increases. The Town proposes a 3% base rate increase to keep up with inflation effective July 1, 2026, and the following consecutive years (July 1, 2027, July 1, 2028, July 1, 2029, and July 1, 2030) evaluating rates for adequacy at that time. Subsequent adjustment to the rates and the charges for the use of the System will be made by a resolution of the Council duly adopted after a public hearing with notice thereof given as provided by law.

SECTION 5: Effective Date of Resolution: This resolution shall be immediately filed with the Town Clerk/Treasurer and shall become effective July 14, 2025.
